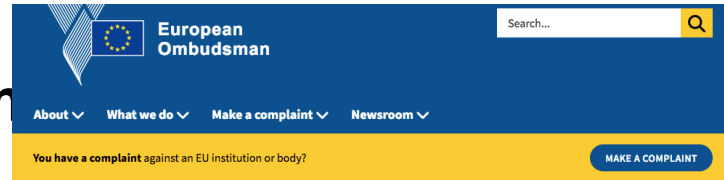
 **Not evidence-based**
