COMMON PROVISIONS REGULATION (CPR) POSITION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT

Funding for regions over the period 2021-2027 should not diminish:

- Budget proposed by the EP EUR 378,1 billion
- Budget proposed by the EC EUR 330,6 billion

Higher EU co-financing rates for projects:

- 85 % for less developed regions (EC proposal 70 %)
- 65 % for transition regions (EC proposal 55 %)
- 50 % for more developed regions (EC proposal 40 %)

EU should keep investing in all regions to boost economic and social cohesion



CPR POSITION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT (II)





Allocating support from Funds according to the most recent statistical classification of the regions



NUTS-2 level regions in Lithuania (example):

- 1. Less developed Central and Western (GDP per capita < 75 % of the EU average)
- 2. More developed Capital region (GDP per capita > 100 % of the EU average)

Commission Regulation (EU) No 2066/2016 of 21 November 2016 amending the annexes to Regulation (EC) No 1059/2003



CPR – POSITION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT (III)

- Rural Development Fund (EAFRD) brought back under umbrella of the CPR
- Provisions of the CPR must continue to apply to LEADER
- Support to CLLD is mandatory, not optional ("ERDF, the ESF+, the EMFF and the EAFRD shall support community-led local development")
- Possibility of cross-funding from different Funds (ERDF, ESF+, Cohesion Fund, EAFRD) should remain for LEADER

POSITION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT (IV)

MS Shall ensure:




CLLD is transparent: no interest group, including the public sector, is in control of the decision-making process



Support from Funds for CLLD strengthens LAGs' administrative capacities



Active use of the CLLD strategy, in order to facilitate the exchange of information and to support potential beneficiaries in the preparation of applications





CAP STRATEGIC PLANS REGULATION POSITION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT

Financialenvelopeforruraldevelopmentfortheperiod2021-2027:

- EP proposal EUR 109 000 million in current prices
- EC proposal EUR 78 811 million in current prices

CAP funding after 2020 should be maintained at the current level





CAP SP POSITION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT (II)



EAFRD Interventions in level 2 NUTS-2 Regions (aligned with CPR)



less developed regions, GDP per capita < 75 % of the EU average



transition regions, GDP per capita 75 % \geq 100% of the EU average



more developed regions, GDP per capita > 100 % of the EU average

Rural development funds allocated among the three categories of regions classified according to the most recent statistical division

CAP SP POSITION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT (III)





Increased EAFRD maximum EU co-financing rates:

- 85 % in the outermost regions and the smaller Aegean islands (EC proposal 70 %)
- 85 % in less developed regions (EC proposal 70 %)
- 65 % in regions in transition (NEW EP proposal)
- 75 % for regions with natural or area specific constraints (EC proposal 65 %)
- 53 % in other regions (EC proposal 43 %)
- 90 % to LEADER (EC proposal 80 %)



CAP SP POSITION OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT (IV)

Increased involvement of LAGs in prepration of CAP Stategic Plans:

- MS shall ensure in particular LAGs in the context of LEADER are fully involved in development of CAP SP
- CAP SP shall contain mandatory summary of comments submitted by the competent regional and local authorities, including LAGs
- Partnership shall be organised transparently code of conduct prepared by the EC to support MS in organisation and implementation of the partnership principle

EAFRD support for LEADER Cooperation:

- LEADER exempted from requirement to have at least one partner involved in agricultural production
- LAGs may request up to 50 % advance from Paying Agency for running and animation costs
